

## 10. Horn Hill

3½ miles [shorter route 2¼ miles]

A delightful rural walk with new views opening up as you pass through each field.

Birdsong from the many hedges, woods and wayside trees.

**Easy Access** \*\* Several stiles and some small hills, muddy paths in winter

**Refreshments** \*\*\* 1 pub: The Dumb Bell 01494 872166

**Public Transport** \* 335 Slough to Newlands Park. Once every 2 hrs. Monday to Saturday.

### By Road

Cheena Meadow car park can be reached from the A413 at Chalfont St Peter by heading up Joiners Lane from the roundabout by. The Greyhound pub then turning left at the T-Junction.

[1] From the Denham Way bus stop head south then turn left at the public footpath sign, turn left again almost immediately and follow the path between two hedges. Cross the stile and continue across the fields until you reach Roberts Wood.

[2] Follow the path straight ahead to a crossroads. Turn right and walk out of the woods and across the fields following the footpath markers. Cross Roberts Lane and walk along a footpath through a paddock then across a field, turn left onto Shire Lane. Continue past the Dumb Bell then turn left and take the right hand footpath straight across the large field until you reach Brawlings Lane.

*For the shorter route follow the left footpath after the Dumb Bell across the field, turn left through Kiln Wood then right onto Rickmansworth Lane. Then follow the description from point 5.*

[3] On the other side of the road follow the footpath. After the second kissing gate head diagonally across the field then follow the hedge on your right down the hill. Turn left at the crossroads then follow the path along the edge of the field, walk straight across the next field then continue along the path with the hedge on your left.

[4] Turn left at the crossroads keeping the hedge immediately on your left. After passing through the kissing gate head across the fields following the public footpath markers. Turn right when you reach the road then turn right at the crossroads.

*Sheltering under the shade of some magnificent trees is the tiny church of St Paul's. Buried in the graveyard is Maria Korda a silent movie star of the 1920's and wife of Alexander Korda – the film director who worked at the nearby Denham Studios.*

[5] Turn left onto the first footpath and follow this up the slope, over a stile, along the field edge then turn right into Roberts Wood through the kissing gate. Turn left where the path forks and follow this to the crossroads. Turn right and follow the path down the hill and past the houses on your right back to the bus stop.
